

# Louisville Visual Art Annual Report | FY 2022

## Nurturing Louisville Artists Throughout their Creative Lifecycles

### Year in Review

- Children's Fine Art Classes and the Academy of LVA served over 1100 students from nearly 200 home schools in 11 counties of Kentuckiana at more than 30 sites.
- Curate, Purchase, Inspire launched as an inspiring initiative to bring local artists' work to spaces operated by area non-profits.
- The Local Muse began supporting local artists by providing them free booth space at area art fairs, as well as best practices training for success.
- Summer art camps served hundreds of students.
- Open Doors art-centric outreach enriched the lives of 1000+ at-risk youth and adults in marginalized communities.
- The annual art[squared] fundraiser engaged 200+ artists, raising almost \$60,000.
- The LVA Honors Luncheon recognized Shohei Katayama, Janet Britt, Clare Hirn, and William Duffy, raising over \$30,000.
- The Free Wall provided a space for aspiring muralists to refine designs and create full-scale work to market themselves.

### Highlights

The high quality and success of the first round of Curate, Purchase, Inspire proposals shows that LVA remains responsive to the needs and interests of the Louisville art community.

With key support from the Kentucky Arts Council and the Louisville Fund for the Arts, LVA also partners with Family and Children's Place, Waterfront Park, the Juneteenth Commission, Art Sanctuary, Kore Gallery, St. Joe's Children Home, Metro Government, the Kentucky School for the Blind Charitable Foundation, United Crescent Hill Ministries, and others. These connections deepen our investment in communities throughout the city, fulfilling our mission and promising further growth.

2022 saw major advancement of our unique *Multisensory Public Art for Clifton* project, a free-standing mosaic 'wall' celebrating the history and community spirit of the Clifton neighborhood that will also be sensory accessible to blind and visually impaired people.
